MEMORANDUM FOR ALL NTLCS PERSONNEL

SUBJECT: CAMP AIRMAN 2013 OPERATIONS ORDER

1. **MISSION:** To teach the basic necessary classes of bivouacking, team building activities for participants and to provide additional leadership experiences for staff.
2. **LOCATION:** Lake Park (17302 Dale Mabry Hwy N, Lutz, FL 33548).
 - i. **MAIN FRONT GATE WILL CLOSE AT 6:30 pm.**
 - ii. **WE WILL BE USING THE BACK ENTRANCE. FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS.**
 - iii. **FROM DALE MABRY HWY AND VAN DYKE RD. TURN WEST ON VAN DYKE RD. TURN SOUTH ON WHIRLEY RD (FIRST STREET ON SOUTH OF VAN DYKE). TURN LEFT ON FIRST DIRT ENTRANCE TO PARK (NO PARK SIGN THERE) WE WILL HAVE SOMEONE AT THIS LOCATION TO OPEN GATE. FOLLOW SIGNS TO CAMP SITE.**
3. **DATE:** Will be held the weekend of Friday 27 Sept, to Sunday 29 Sept at *Lake Park* (17302 Dale Mabry Hwy N, Lutz, FL 33548)
4. **TIME.** Staff members are to arrive no earlier than 1730 and no later than 1830 on 27 Sept. Participants are to arrive no earlier than 1800 and no later than 1900 on 27 Sept. Front gate will be locked after that. Pick up time will be on Sunday 29 Sept at 1500.
5. **TRANSPORTATION:** All members are to provide their own transportation to the event. All cadets with privately owned vehicles are to turn in their keys. The Civil Air Patrol and its affiliates are not responsible for any damage and/or theft to any participant's vehicle and/or its contents.
6. **COST.** None
7. **DEADLINE for APPLICATIONS:** **Tuesday 24 Sept 2013**
8. **REQUIREMENTS:** All members must have completed OPSEC, Intro to Safety, members over 18 years old must have CPPT completed
9. **APPLICATION:** Cadet applicants must submit a FLWG Form 500 (Cadet Activity Application) Scanned electronic copies will be accepted; however the applicant must ensure that all signatures are on the form prior to submitting. Applications require at least one parent signature (witness not required) and the signature of either the squadron commander or deputy commander for cadets. Applicants will ensure all medical information is provided accurately and correctly. Applications will be submitted to Capt Steven Gay. There is not cost for this bivouac. North Tampa-Lutz Cadet Squadron members commander will sign when received.

10. **UNIFORM.** BDU'S See Attachment 1 Note: If a cadet member has joined within the preceding 60 days of the activity's start and does not have the battle dress uniform, then the cadet may wear an alternative uniform as followed: Blue Jeans, white T-shirt or squadron T-shirt, ball cap, belt, shoes, and socks. The T-shirt will be tucked in. All grooming standards will be adhered
11. **CODE OF CONDUCT:** All members will maintain a professional demeanor throughout the course of the bivouac. The Cadet Honor Code, Cadet Protection Program, and Core Values will

be strictly enforced. Any and all members who pose significant disciplinary problems are subject to early dismissal from the activity. It will be the responsibility of the member and/or parents to immediately secure transportation from the bivouac.

12. MEALS: **NO Cadet will be provided any food from any Senior Member.** Members will be conducting their own cooking and preparing their own food. Members must bring at least **two** breakfasts, **two** lunches and **one** dinner. Snacks are permissible. Members **should eat before arrival** on Friday and are not eating dinner before dismissal on Sunday. Drinks will be provided (water and Gatorade) bring your own canteen/cups **PAPER CUPS WILL NOT BE PROVIDED.** NO SODAS, CANDY, GUM OR COOLERS ARE PERMITTED See Attachment 3 for recommended items.

13. MEDICATION: Cadet has no history or injury or disease which might be affected by this activity except those previously noted in the Medical Information section of the first page of this document and is able to participate without the physical/emotional support or others. **Also, he/she is capable of taking any prescribed medication without supervision.**

SAFETY. Safety is our number one priority. The Opening safety briefing will include campsite, cooking, and Camp ground Orientation. The safety officer and cadet staff will maintain a constant watch on all participants for safety. Safety is our number one priority. The safety officer and cadet staff will maintain a constant watch on all participants for safety. Safety of personnel and assets (CAP and public) will be the number one priority. A safety/ORM briefing will be conducted by the activity Safety Officer or Commander to include discussion about hazards, with focus on weather and hydration. Additional safety briefings will be held prior to all activities where additional hazards are expected to address these hazards. Air/Ground Ops will coordinate with Mission Staff to ensure that critical mission/safety information is briefed to aircrew and ground teams (See CAPR 60-1 and mission checklists). The Activity commander and the safety officer have completed ORM to the intermediate level. **all adult members will have completed CPPT.** Both the activity commander and activity safety officer will have quick and easy means to access the Wing Emergency Notification Hotline (WENH) at 1 888-359-4727 and will be familiar with reporting through this system (CAPR 62-2). After utilization of the WENH and following Wing's immediate directives, Group Safety Staff and/or Group Command staff will be notified. Posting of this Ops Order is acknowledgment that this reporting responsibility is understood and will be complied with IAW FLWG directives.

15. EQUIPMENT: See Attachment 2 - Equipment List. Equipment will be inspected for prohibited items. Contraband will be confiscated and returned at the end of the bivouac.

- i. Review equipment list carefully.** Any equipment brought that is not listed on the equipment list will be considered contraband and confiscated upon arrival. Do not bring anything not specifically listed. It is recommended that the cadet packs his or her gear so that it may all be transported with relative ease in one single trip. You will carry your gear to camp site. 300 - 400 foot walk.

No candy, gum, soda, no Coleman white fuel stoves or lanterns

Any of these items will be confiscated and will be given back after the Bivouac or Squadron meeting.
